<p>Outline of travel and accommodation logistics</p>	<p>All athletes made their own travel arrangements and paid for entries (ammunition and targets/markers included in entry fees).</p>
<p>Outline of Competition Logistics</p>	<p>All competitions were fired in a randomly squadded format, with individuals firing three to a target, other than in the Queen's and St Georges final stages at long range, where they fire two to a target. Because the competitions run all day, the conditions can be markedly different for the competitors in the same competition making it difficult to assess absolute performance in any one competition. However, during the week, there are generally 3-4 competitions or stages of a competition shot at the same distance and the overall squadding is set up to give competitors shoots at different times of day at each of the various distances to try to even out variability in conditions.</p> <p>In the Queen's and Prize and St George's, the top 300 ex around 1000 shoot together in a second round and the top 100 shoot together in the final.</p> <p>There were two team matches for the Scottish team – the National Match teams of 20 versus England/Ireland/Wales at short range and the Mackinnon at long range for teams of 12 against all other</p>

	nations present (usually about 7-8 teams) On the Friday morning, the Kolapore match is held for GB (teams of 8) versus other nations present. This is a coached shoot at 300/500/600 yards and is probably the most highly pressurised match in which anyone can shoot because of it's very high visibility.

This weekend was far too close to the Commonwealth Games for a GB selection event, and the schedule published far too late, given that our training camp dates had been set in stone as early as the summer of 2013. This had a direct impact on the chances of our selected Commonwealth Games athletes' opportunities to be selected for the World Championships, and in the end none of them were selected. This is particularly galling in the case of Sian Bruce, who tied under the BICTSF selection process after the completion of the July selection match, but was denied the opportunity to shoot-off for the place given that she was not present at the selection match. A number of other options to split the tie were available to British Shooting, but none of them taken.

The Pairs competition was shot over two days, the first at short range (300/500/600 yards) and the second day at long range (900 and 1000 yards). The weather for the first day was fine, with light winds and good light, so the scoring was very high, Scotland were 4th after the short range with only 2 points separating the top 7 teams. The second day's shooting was seeded from the scores on the first day, with the top 9 teams shooting together on the second detail at long range. On the second day the wind was slightly tricky at 900 yards, but did not prevent high scoring. The sea mist then came in, delaying shooting at 1000 yards for over 4 hours. When shooting resumed at around 17:00, the visibility was poor and then there was some heavy rain for the first detail. Visibility worsened for the second detail and was extremely dull by conclusion of shooting at around 18:30 for the second detail. Although there was virtually no wind, a lot of points were being dropped to elevation (unusual in a field of this class) and one of the Australian pair crossfired (shot on the wrong target and lost 5 points), probably due to the poor visibility.

In the individual match, again the final day's shooting was seeded after the short range, with the top half of the field shooting on the second detail at long range on the third day. The first day had interesting conditions in which it was easy to score well but also easy to drop points due to light very changeable winds, with only one 105 ex 105 recorded. Ian and Angus both scored 102's placing them well down the field around 14th. The scoring on the second day was better with excellent conditions leading to very high scores. Ian scored 149 ex 150 and Angus scored 150 – despite that, it hardly moved them up the field. On the third day, the wind had changed direction completely and increased in strength dramatically, coming from the rear, rather than the lazy headwind fishtails that had been prevalent. The scores at 900 yards started to open out slightly and with Ian and Angus both scoring 73's against only three 74's being recorded, moved them up the field to within the top 9 and only 3-4 behind the leader. At 1000 yards, the wind had become very lively, switching left and right very rapidly, and the scores from the first detail indicated the difficulty. In the second detail, there were only two score of 70 or above ex 75, one by the Gold winner (David Luckman) who made an outstanding shoot of 74 ex 75, the other by the Bronze winner Parag Patel on 70. All the scores on the previous ranges were almost immaterial, as points were being shed all over the place, with the joint leader up to then, from Australia, scoring only 59 to drop into oblivion. Ian scored 64 and Angus 63, to finish 9th and 10th respectively – both lost points to some very wide shots and could have easily been in contention for a medal had they fared better with the wind.

<p>Outline of travel and accommodation logistics</p>	<p>A series of preparation events took place, including access to the venue (other than the Fullbore range) in early July, the Team Camp (including kitting-out) in Stirling followed by the Training Camps in Hannover and Malaga and the NRA Imperial Meeting, and finally the Preparation Camp prior to moving into the Satellite Village at the Carnoustie Golf Hotel. These were all mandatory components of the preparation of the team, planned in consultation with all of the support team based on experience of previous Commonwealth and Olympic Games, and communicated to the athletes nine months in advance and reinforced at regular intervals.</p> <p>Until arrival at the Preparation Camp on the 16th of July, all travel and accommodation arrangements were made by Performance Programme staff, using established routes and hotels. Fullbore Rifle did not attend the Preparation Camp, remaining at Bisley to complete the NRA Imperial Meeting on 19th July, the athletes arriving in Carnoustie on 20th July.</p> <p>Transport and Accommodation at the Preparation Camp in Stirling was arranged by the Prep Camp team and was excellent, as were the other support services put in place in the University.</p> <p>Accommodation at the Satellite Village exceeded expectations, and the accommodation at the Games Village in Glasgow was fairly typical of major Games. Catering at both venues was excellent, although the lunches provided at Barry Buddon did contain a huge number of calories.</p> <p>Ten of the sixteen selected athletes, two Coaches and the Team Manager returned to the village and attended the Closing Ceremony. For the six athletes who did not return to the village, two were heading off to another competition in Canada and USA, but for the other four a real opportunity to understand and enjoy the wider context of being part of Team Scotland was missed.</p> <p>Games transport was generally excellent, although travel time between the hotel and the venue was lengthy given the need to avoid both low railway bridges and more importantly the main street through Carnoustie. The venue was within walking distance,</p>																																																																	

	<p>and many took advantage of this route around/through the golf course in great weather. Transport on the venue was a challenge at times, with a number of teams protesting at the lack of shuttle bus between the central hub and the Shotgun ranges. This was rectified, although it is not clear how many made use of it. Walking between the ranges was the norm, with a daily total of 5 – 10 miles for some of the support team.</p> <p>Transport to/from Glasgow was arranged by combination of G2014 and Team Scotland depending on the specifics of the events, and other than some lengthy detours via the Apex Hotel in Dundee, with delays for mandatory rest periods for drivers, went smoothly.</p> <p>Transport for various media events in Glasgow was provided by either Team Scotland, or the media organisations in question – particularly the BBC. Transport between the village and Scotland House was easiest using the train. The bus service for the Closing Ceremony and the subsequent function and Scotland House were excellent, with a police escort provided for the team between the two.</p>
<p>Outline of Competition logistics</p>	<p>The Full-Bore Rifle event was somewhat unique in the Games, as there were 5 consecutive days of competition. The Pairs event was shot on the 25th and 26th July and the Individual match on the 27th, 28th and 29th.</p> <p>The Pairs Match was shot at 300/500/600 yards, 2 sighting shots and 10 to count at each range on the first day and 900/1000 yards with 2 and 15 at each range on the second day. In this match, one of the pair shot whilst the other coached him and then they swapped places.</p> <p>The Individual Match was fired over 3 days, the first day with 2 sighters and 7 to count at 300/500/600, the second day with the same distances but 10 to count and the final day at 900 and 1000 yards with 15 to count at each range. In both matches, there were two details, because of insufficient targets to accommodate the field, and in both events the top half of the field were seeded after short range to shoot together at 900 and 1000 yards.</p> <p>All of the ISSF disciplines were run to ISSF Rules, with a very tight schedule which kept Pre-Event training to short sessions, particularly for the Three Positions Rifle events.</p>
